

AMLD Pool Closing Policy

The Anderson Mill Limited District maintains two swimming pools within our district that are open to our residents for classes, activities, and recreational swimming.

Although we remain open except on scheduled holidays, there are circumstances that make it necessary to close. It has always been the policy of the AMLD to assure that the wellbeing, health, and safety our patrons is our first priority at all times.

Weather:

Thunder/Lightning:

In the event of thunder and/or lightning, the pools will immediately be cleared and will be closed for 30 minutes after each occurrence.

Rain:

When the rainfall is heavy enough that the bottom of the pool is not clearly visible, the pools are closed until 5 minutes after the lifeguard staff verifies that the bottom is clearly visible.

Wind:

If the wind speed causes flying debris, the pools will be cleared until it is safe for patrons and staff to be on deck and/or in the water.

Cold:

The pools are closed if the actual air temperature or the wind chill dips to 34 degrees or below and that temperature is sustained for 30 minutes.

However, should there be mixed precipitation or dramatically falling temperatures, the pool will be closed immediately.

Other factors:

Despite our best planning, training, and preparation, there is always the possibility of a problem. Equipment can break, repairs must be made, etc.

The water chemistry is tested hourly to keep our water clean and at the proper chlorination level. Should we suspect any type of contamination from an outside source, the pool would be immediately closed until further tests are completed and the necessary actions taken.
